BY MR. SIKES:

Q When Frank Jones testified concerning your meeting with him on May 11 and May 12 and testified concerning the things that you told him, Frank Jones was lying; is that right, Mr. Bolden? Is that what you are saying?

A Yes, sir.

Q Now when Mrs. Terpinas testifies that she had a conversation with you on May 11, 1964, she is also lying?

A Absolutely.

MR. HOWARD: Objection to the last question, unless he specifies what the conversation was.

THE COURT: Well, I do not think that there is any difficulty with that. He just got through reciting what she had testified to a short time ago, in the form of a question. I think that will be all right. It may stand.

Q When Mr. Martineau testified concerning the conversation that he had with you on May 18, 1964,
